### 2) Notables

- Site work for the county radio tower began in July.
- Department heads and Village staff started collaborating on budgets for 2024.
- Chief Bishop and Officer Rosales began a series of meetings with the Kewaskum School District in regards to active attack strategies and responses.
- Officer Roth attend the required 56 hour training to become a Firearms Instructor for our department.
- Emergency Communication Systems completed the upgrade to our outdoor emergency warning sirens and all sirens are in operation.

### 3) Cases of Interest

**07-01-2023 – MUNICIPAL ORDINANCE** – Officer made contact with subjects placing tarps on hill prior to 6 am on 07-01-2023.

**07-01-2023 – DISORDERLY CONDUCT** – While on patrol an officer overheard two males verbally arguing. One male was unloading his semi-truck which was still running while parked. The other male was upset that the truck was running that late at night. The upset male party was banging his hand on the semi-truck while they argued. He also mentioned getting a firearm. A citation for Disorderly Conduct was issued.

**07-03-2023 – WARRANT** – A subject was arrested on a Washington County Sheriff's warrant after the officer conducted a random license plate check.

**07-03-2023 – FIREWORKS** – Officers received multiple reports of fireworks being used in the Village. A subject on Whisper Lane was cited after multiple calls were received.

**07-03-2023 – RUNAWAY JUVENILE / DISORDERLY CONDUCT** – Officers took a report of a 15 year old girl who ran off with a friend after being involved in underage sexual activities with her boyfriend. The juvenile returned while officers were receiving information; however it was then learned that a physical altercation occurred between the juvenile's boyfriend and her mother's boyfriend. Ultimately, the adult male party was issued a citation for disorderly conduct.

**07-03-2023 – SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY** – Officer on duty observed a car alarm sounding with a subject nearby. The subject was ID'd and their presence was verified with the residence. There were no issues.

**07-07-2023 – OWI 2<sup>nd</sup> Offense** – A subject was arrested for OWI 2<sup>nd</sup> after being stopped for deviating from his lane of travel. He performed Standardized Field Sobriety Testing which indicated he was under the influence of an intoxicant. A preliminary breath test showed a blood alcohol level of 0.204. He was arrested for OWI 2<sup>nd</sup> and received citations for Underage Possession / Consumption of Alcohol, Display of Unauthorized Registration and Lane Deviation.

**07-07-2023 – THEFT** – An unlocked vehicle was entered where a wallet as well as loose cash was taken from the vehicle.

**07-07-2023 – OPEN DOOR** – The officer on duty observed an open vehicle door. The owner was contacted and verified nothing appeared out of the ordinary.

**07-07-2023 – DRUGS** – A female contacted police after she attempted to fill the gas tank on her rental vehicle and located marijuana inside the gas cover. It was taken into evidence and secured.

**07-28-2023 – THEFT** – Multiple reports were received of unlocked vehicles and garages being entered. In most instances, any amount of money found was taken. A suspect has been located and charges are pending further investigation.

**07-28-2023 – DOG COMPLAINT** – We responded to the report of a dog inside a vehicle for approximately 20 minutes. The dog was panting, but was also barking and moving around. All four windows were open on the vehicle. No action taken.

**07-29-2023 – OPEN DOOR** – The officer on duty stopped at several homes where open garage doors were observed. Due to recent vehicle/garage entries, owners were advised of same.

**07-30-2023 – OWI 8<sup>th</sup>** – Officer responded to a call regarding a male bleeding from his head refusing medical attention in the area of Bonnie Lane and Courtney Lane. After investigation, his vehicle was located at the dead end of Bonnie Lane stuck on top of a rock retaining wall. The driver stated he wasn't familiar with the area and made a wrong turn, crashing onto the rock retaining wall. He was ultimately arrested for his 8<sup>th</sup> offense OWI and was placed on a Probation Hold.

**07-31-2023 – TRAFFIC** – A report of a vehicle all over the road determined the driver's phone fell to floor and driver stated they must have swerved while reaching for it. Driver warned for inattentive driving.

Press Release – July 3rd Fireworks and Rescue Calls

On July 3rd, 2023, just after the conclusion of the fireworks display, the Kewaskum Fire Department was dispatched to five (5) rescue calls within a 19 minute period.

9:56pm – Kewaskum Rescue responded to a rescue call at 1111 Fond du Lac Ave for a report of a male party in cardiac arrest. CPR was started by civilians and then further performed by Kewaskum Police Department and Kewaskum Rescue EMT's. An AED was also utilized during the cardiac event. West Bend Paramedic Intercept was also requested. The patient was transported by Kewaskum Rescue.

10:01pm – Kewaskum Rescue responded in Riverhill Park for a female party experiencing a seizure.

10:05pm – Kewaskum Rescue personnel responded in Riverhill Park for a female party who fell and possibly broke her leg. Due to Kewaskum Rescue already on other calls, mutual aid was requested from West Bend Fire Department to respond to the scene.

10:13pm – Kewaskum Rescue was dispatched to a rescue call in the Town of Farmington for a female experiencing an allergic reaction. Due to Kewaskum Rescue already on other calls, mutual aid was requested from West Bend Fire Department to respond to the scene.

10:15pm – Kewaskum Rescue was dispatched to 1052 Fond du Lac Ave for a report of a diabetic female who was having trouble breathing. Due to Kewaskum Rescue already on other calls, mutual aid was requested from Campbellsport Fire Department to respond to the scene. The patient went into cardiac arrest and West Bend Paramedic Intercept was also requested by Campbellsport Rescue.

The Village of Kewaskum is appreciative for the support received from surrounding departments and good Samaritans on scene to assist during this period of time.
