

Pet Licensing – Village of Kewaskum

Pet licenses may be purchased at the Village Hall, by mail or by placing the application and rabies certificate in the payment drop box located at 204 First Street.

IF MAILING OR PLACING IN THE PAYMENT DROP BOX, A SELF-ADDRESSED STAMPED ENVELOPE MUST BE PROVIDED

Application for Dog License

Application of Cat License

All dogs and cats over five (5) months of age on January 1 of any year, or five (5) months of age within the license year, **MUST** be licensed annually, in compliance with Kewaskum Code of Ordinance Sec. 10-41 and WI State Statute 174.05. The license year commences on January 1 and ends on December 31.

A CURRENT RABIES VACCINATION CERTIFICATE MUST ACCOMPANY THIS APPLICATION

The vaccination certificate must be certified by a licensed veterinarian and presented at the time of licensing. The certificate shall include the expiration date, the vaccination manufacturing serial number and written proof of your dog's neutering, if applicable. **A license will not be issued without proof of vaccination.**

Payment of the required pet license must be made prior to April 1 of each year, or within thirty (30) days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog or cat.

Dog

A late fee of \$5.00 will be assessed and collected from every owner of a dog or cat over five (5) months of age, if the owner fails to obtain a license prior to April 1 of each year, or within thirty (30) days of acquiring ownership of a licensable dog or cat.

The owner or keeper of any animal licensed or unlicensed, shall not permit the animal to run at large in the village. Without proper license tag attached to collar it shall be presumptive evidence that the animal is unlicensed. Any police officer within the village shall cause any animal running at large to be seized, impounded or restrained.

If someone no longer owns a dog or cat that was licensed in the village, they must notify the village, so the village can update and/or remove the pet from the records.
