

**Village of Kewaskum
Sex Offender Ordinance Summary**

STEP 1 – AM I AN OFFENDER?

“Offender” – you are considered an “offender” under Village Ordinance if:

- You have to register as a sex offender AND
 - You were convicted of a Crime against Children, or
 - You are a Special Bulletin Notification (SBN), which includes Chapter 980 commitments

STEP 2 – CAN I LIVE IN THE VILLAGE OF KEWASKUM?

Domicile Restriction – If you are an “offender” in Step 1, then:

- You may NOT live in the Village of Kewaskum unless you lived in the Village when you committed your last offense which resulted in the your most recent conviction for a sexually violent offense and / or crime against children.
- If 10 years has passed since the date on which you completed your entire sentence (prison, probation, supervision, ect), and you have not been convicted of an additional sex offense, then you MAY live in Kewaskum, but you are still subject to residency restrictions.

STEP 3 – IF I CAN LIVE IN KEWASKUM, WHERE CAN I LIVE?

Residency Restriction

- If you are allowed to live in the Village of Kewaskum, you must live further than 750 feet away from certain locations per ordinance.
- If you are a Chapter 980 placement in the Village, you must live further than 1500 feet from certain locations outlined in Wisconsin Stats 980.08 (2015 Wis Act 156) as well as 750 feet from locations outlined in Village ordinance that are not specified in State Statue.

STEP 4 – APPEAL PROCESS

- Offenders can appeal this ordinance for an individualized risk assessment. Appeals should be made to the Protection and Public Safety Committee via the Village Clerk’s Office.
